

Parking & Public Transportation

Lions Eye Institute (LEI) is situated on the Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre (QEII MC) site where current redevelopment projects are occurring. Thus, parking may be limited at times. If you plan to drive to LEI for your appointment please allow extra time to find parking.

If you need any assistance with parking and directions please phone the LEI volunteers on 9381 0783 or visit them at the help desk on the ground floor at the entrance to the Institute.

Parking

The most accessible parking to the LEI is at Car Park 5 in the basement of the Cancer Centre building on Gairdner Drive. The LEI is diagonally opposite the Cancer Centre. The best way to access LEI is to take the lift in the car park to LG level and walk out the main entrance of the building. Please pay at the automated station in the car park before leaving. The fee for parking is \$3.30 per hour. The ticket machine accepts major credit cards or coins for payment.

ACROD Parking

There are a number of ACROD parking bays available which are denoted on the site map overleaf. Visitor parking fees apply.

Drop Off Bays

There are a few 15 minute drop off and collection bays located outside the LEI entrance. Please be aware that these bays are electronically monitored.

Public Transportation

Buggy Service

The QEII MC Trust operates a free buggy service to assist patients and visitors to get around the site if required. For pick-up, phone the buggy operator between 9am and 4pm on 0481 438 731.

Bus and Train Services

There are extensive bus services connecting the QEII MC with the city, train lines and surrounding suburbs. A number of bus stops are located outside the main entrances to Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital at E and G block along Hospital Avenue. The LEI is a 5 minute walk from here. From the main entrance, travel through the hospital to Watling Walk and follow the signs to LEI at AA block.
