Lions Eye Institute expands eye care in Midland

Residents in Perth's eastern suburbs will have access to a wide range of premier eye care services following a relocation and expansion of the long-established Midland Eye Clinic, whose practitioners now include Lions Eye Institute ophthalmologist Dr Hessom Razavi.

The new-look clinic will formally open on Wednesday, January 9, with a team of top ophthalmologists offering a range of specialist services in general ophthalmology, medical retina, cataract surgery, glaucoma, pterygium surgery and colour vision problems.

Dr Razavi will become the fifth member of the Midland practice.

"Midland Eye Clinic has a very strong team of specialist doctors committed to providing the best eye care for people living in the east metropolitan region," Dr Razavi said.

"It is good news for people who live in Midland because it gives them access to the latest eye treatments and technologies at a location that is close to their homes, and is more convenient for people who live east of Perth or in the Wheatbelt than visiting a doctor in the city."

Dr Razavi completed his ophthalmology training in Western Australia. He was the inaugural Lions Outback Vision Fellow, providing outreach services to remote and Indigenous communities, as well as Timor-Leste and the Solomon Islands.

He then completed a medical retina fellowship at the Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital and the Centre for Eye Research Australia. His research interests include Indigenous eye health, tele-ophthalmology and online medical education.
